The format of the paper as follows:

- 1. Title of the paper.
- 2. The name of the author (authors' affiliation, including the province, city and postal code). If more one author, separate the names by comma, and sequential number attached to each author, e.g., "Nicki R. Crick ¹". Authors' affiliation will also be notified by sequential number, e.g., "1. Division of Sports Science and physical education, Tsinghua University, Beijing 100084".
- 3. Key words (three—eight, separate by semi-colon).
- 4. Author's introduction, including: name, birth, sex, nationality, professional rank, academic degree, current position, research area, and contact details (address, phone number and e-mail)
- 5. The paper will not exceed 6,000 words, including charts, tables and graphs. Use Microsoft Word to proceed and formatted according to the APA (American Psychological Association) Style Manual.
- 6. At least five references.

The format of the English abstract as follows:

- 1. Title of the paper in English
- 2. The name of the author (authors' affiliation, including the province, city and postal code). If more one author, separate the names by comma, and sequential number attached to each author, e.g., "Nicki R. Crick ¹". Authors' affiliation will also be notified by sequential number, e.g., "1. Division of Sports Science and physical education, Tsinghua University, Beijing 100084".
- 3. Abstract contains research purpose, methodology, results and conclusion. Key words (three—eight, separate by semi-colon). The main body is 2000 words at maximum, including charts, tables and graphs.
- 4. Author's introduction, including: name, birth, sex, nationality, professional rank, academic degree, current position, research area, and contact details (address, phone number and e-mail)
- 5. At least five references
- 6. Formatted according to the APA (American Psychological Association) Style Manual.
